The intention is to improve communications and stimulate the exchange of ideas between the materials and design communities.

Waste Not! Want Not! - we all have a responsibility to encourage recycling, reuse and the use of recycled materials in place of primary materials. Designers, Architects and Engineers can play a decisive role in this by carefully choosing the materials they use and by designing with reusability and recyclability as a principal design parameter. This MADE workshop will look at a range of the key issues and materials, with examples of success stories.

The programme will commence with refreshments at 10.15 am and presentations will run throughout the day. A buffet lunch will be provided and there will be ample opportunities to allow delegates and speakers to interact on an informal level.

The workshop will be held at 1 Carlton House Terrace, London SW1Y 5DB, home of the Institute of Materials, Minerals and Mining. This venue is in the heart of London, located between Pall Mall and The Mall. It is approximately 5 minutes' walk from Piccadilly Circus underground station and 10 minutes' walk from Charing Cross mainline station. Victoria Station is about 20 minutes away.
